is the hands-on display presented by **Dr. Julia Gray** as she demystifies the confusing world of horse feeds.

The first presentation will start in the auditorium at 8:45, followed by the presentation of our **Educator of the Year Award**. Then, **Dr. Hutten** will share a case study, and after that, we will break for **free coffee and donuts**. Our featured presenters this year are **Dr. Katherine Garrett, diagnostic imaging director at the Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital**, and **Keith Kleine of the AAEP**.

Rochester native **Katie Garrett, DVM**, has been a friend of the Genesee Valley Equine Clinic since she was in high school. She is a sought-after lecturer for many audiences. We have invited her back to her home town to present "**Advances in Equine Diagnostic Imaging: Taking a Better Look Inside**." Drawing from cases she has helped manage, she will demonstrate the need for getting a better look inside the horse using radiology, ultrasonography, and MRI.

In the last decade, the technology available for imaging horses has

advanced tremendously. Using an ultrasound machine in initial workups is becoming almost as common as using a stethoscope. Digital radiographs have made getting consultations about difficult orthopedic cases as easy as sending an email. MRI has been modified enough to allow the imaging of the standing or recumbent horse.

Dr. Garrett will explain some of the most important technological advances in internal imaging and the benefits that can be obtained by using them.

After finishing her undergraduate studies at Dartmouth, Dr. Garrett

studied veterinary medicine at Cornell and was a classmate of Dr. Hutten's. She completed her studies at Cornell in 2003 and did an internship at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, KY. There she has been ever since, serving as ambulatory clinician, surgical resident, and most recently as the diagnostic imaging director.

Dr. Garrett is responsible for the equipment and expertise required to supply 35 staff veterinarians and 12 veterinary interns with what they need to obtain high-quality diagnostic images of equine patients.

The Bluegrass state will be well represented as **Keith Kleine** will also be joining us from Lexington. As director of industry relations for the American Association of Equine Practitioners, Keith will present "*The AAEP: Helping Veterinarians, Horses, and Their Owners.*" At this presentation you will hear about the broad scope of work being done by the AAEP on behalf of horses and their caregivers.

The AAEP mission statement is: "To improve the health and welfare of the horse, to further the professional development of its members, and to provide resources and leadership for the benefit of the equine community."

Keith will provide information about the role that AAEP plays in equine welfare, owner education, monitoring of infectious disease, funding of important research, continuing education for veterinarians, and many other topics that will help you understand what goes on outside of your own pasture and community to ensure that individual patients or entire herds of horses are getting what they need.

Keith has been working in this role with the AAEP for six years and will share examples of the work being done by this 9,500-member-strong organization. Keith Kleine and Dr. Dwyer have been working together since she was appointed to AAEP's Executive Committee.

We look forward to seeing you on the first Saturday in February for a fun and informative morning.

From the North: Take Route 383 (Scottsville Rd.) south. At the stoplight past the Dollar General Plaza, turn right (west) onto North Road. WCHS is one mile down on the left.

From I-390 and Thruway Exit 46: Take Route 253 west to the Scottsville Rd. stoplight. (Watch the route signs carefully as Route 253 travels along many different roads.) At that intersection, continue straight (west) on North Road. WCHS is one mile down on the left.

The high school is approximately a 15-minute drive from either Thruway Exit 47 from the west or Exit 46 from the east.




